## THE NEW ZEALAND STORY

The ancestors of my "Devine Family" lived in Donegal County, Ireland.

John Devine and Maggie Devine (nee Mc Kinlay) had Hugh Devine (April 1, 1850 -12 March 1926). Hugh was born and educated in Rawmochy, (Raymoghy) Donegal County, Ireland, and raised on his father's farm. He arrived in Auckland, New Zealand on 2 February 1870 onboard the "Mary Shepherd", which then brought him to Lyttelton in the South Island. After landing in Lyttelton, he worked on various farms around Canterbury. He was Head Shepherd for six years at Parnassus, eight years at Balmoral, and four years at Leslie Hills Station. In 1896 Hugh began farming on his own 30 acres of freehold and 70 acres of leasehold land at Rotherham, where he was a member of the Rotherham School Committee.

At 27, Hugh Devine married 19-year-old Annie Bryant daughter of William and Ann Bryant (nee Bond) of Lyttelton, at Holy Trinity Church, Lyttelton on 17 February 1877.

Hugh died 12 March 1926 aged 76, and Annie died 12 May 1937 aged 79.

Arthur James Devine married Mary Jane Gleazier in the Rotherham house of her parents Henry and Jane Gleazier (nee West) on 6 June 1913. The Gleazier Family also emigrated from Ireland.

Mary died 12 August 1954 aged 59. Arthur remarried to Elsie Worthington, and died 2 February 1967 aged 80. Arthur & Mary are both buried at Rotherham Cemetery.

Henry Arthur James Devine, (Jim) married Margaret Mary Truesdale (2 Nov 1912 to 3 Aug 1981), daughter of Thomas James & Jessie Elizabeth Truesdale (nee Wilson), at St James Church, Riccarton, Christchurch on 28 April 1933. Jim, and Margaret lived in Maces Road, Bromley, Christchurch. Jim worked in a foundry in Bromley; they also bred poultry, and sold eggs at their gate. They then moved to Wataroa, Westland, where Jim worked as a farm labourer for a family called Dennehy. From there they moved to the Mangles Valley, Murchison to manage a farm for Joe Boland while he served in WW2, after which they purchased their own farm in the Mangles Valley.
